MARGARET ANNETTE PETERS ADVISING AWARD NOMINATION CRITERIA

The purpose of the Margaret Annette Peters Advising Award is to recognize and reward those faculty/administrators who embody the spirit of caring, compassionate, and genuine concern for the welfare of individual students.

The recipient of the Margaret Annette Peters Advisor Award will receive a plaque and a cash award of \$1000 at the UAC Awards Breakfast in May.

The nominee shall be a faculty member/administrator who has served Texas A&M for two (2) years as of January 1 of the award year and may not be the recipient of this award more than once in a five-year period. Any student, staff or faculty member may make a nomination.

Listed below are the minimum criteria for consideration.

1. Nominee must be a faculty member/administrator who exhibits a caring, compassionate spirit, and genuine concern for the individual student.
2. Must directly assist the student in making academic, development, career or life planning decisions regarding his/her academic program.
3. Follows student's progress toward academic and career goals.
4. Exhibits a mastery of institutional rules, regulations, policies, and procedures.
